






Parents with young children know how important it is to child-proof their homes.

- Parents often put laundry pacs in places that are easily accessible to young children.
- Three million households with children under 4 keep the containers on the washer.*
- And 1 in 4 place laundry pacs on the washer or dryer while doing the laundry.*
- In fact, one-third of parents who bring their children into the laundry room admit that they can reach the laundry detergent.*
